5. Finance and Grants: A detailed sheet was distributed showing the running cost of the Network following the loss of our grant from the West Lothian Council and the Convenor explained the details to the membership.

We are looking at new sources of funding such as the Weir Trust and the Robertson Trust amongst other sources. Councillors have been contacted in respect of their 2018/19 disbursement funds to see if they can donate. Councillors will also be contacted in the new 2019/20 financial year (1st April 2019) to apply for that year's disbursements.

There are lots of great ideas being received from our members with regard to fundraising for which thanks were given.

We were asked about members who wished to give donations so we have brought a container and if anyone wishes to give it would be greatly appreciated. This will be present in addition to the current charity jar at every monthly meeting. It will also be in the office at all other times.

It has been suggested that we organise a petition. However, the feed back we are getting is that 100 letters from members would have a greater effect than 1 petition with 100 signatures. The Convenor encouraged members to write to their Councillor and let them know their views. A great many have already done this and they were thanked for their suppport.

The Network is working in association with Enterprise Bathgate, The West Lothian Bike Library, The Partnership Centre and several of the local supermarkets Details are not all finalised yet but the outline plan is as follows:-

A three star hotel with a city centre location close to the city's main attractions:

- Seville Cathedral and the Giralda (bell tower)- 10-minute walk
- The Alcázar of Seville 10-minute walk
- Barrio de Santa Cruz 10-minute walk
- Plaza de España and Maria Luisa Park 15-minute walk
- Torre del Oro 10-minute walk
- Plaza de la Maestranza 8-minute walk

The price is based on Room Only (typical for city break hotels which often have no restaurant but are close to many bars and restaurants in the city).

To add in breakfast would be approx £11 / day (not recommended). Dinner not available Transfers: (not included): See details in the office

Suggestions for places to visit near to Seville (further details and costs available in the office):

- Jerez the home of sherry
- Cadiz oldest city in Europe on the Costa de la Luz
- Cordoba Mezquita, patios, Alcazar (gardens and palace)

Bookings for this will be taken in the office on Wednesday 20th February. Once 6 bookings have been confirmed we can go back to the travel agent and pay an agreed deposit (approx. £150 or whole amount). More bookings can subsequently be added but air flight costs can increase so early booking is advised. Sharing is advised as a single room will probably cost around an extra £100.
