MINUTES OF MEMBERS' MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY 17th NOVEMBER 2018

IN LEGION SCOTLAND, BATHGATE

The Convenor, Anne Webster, opened the meeting and welcomed the members including new members.

### POLAR ACADEMY-

Anne Webster introduced Fiona Cochrane (parent), Alex Cochrane and Adam (pupils) from the Polar Academy. Fiona informed the members that Bathgate Academy is only the 5<sup>th</sup> school in Scotland to go on this expedition, with 10 children going to Arctic Greenland from 2<sup>nd</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> April 2019. Alex and Adam told of their journey so far, from putting post-it notes up to see if they were selected, the selection process and training they had to undergo – including kayaking, camping out in the Cairngorms and survival skills. Fiona stated that the whole experience aimed to give 10 children from various backgrounds the opportunity to achieve something extraordinary. Total cost is £170,000.00, much of it raised by sponsorship and donations, but the parents also had to do a considerable amount of fundraising. Anne thanked them for coming along and wished everyone involved much success. A huge thank you to everyone that attended and helped to raise £238.54.

### “THE CALDER WITCHES”

Joe Murphy introduced Rev. Joe Povey, who began his talk by giving the historical background to the origins of witches and witchcraft in Scotland, going back to the Reformation. He told very humorous and entertaining stories of the hunt, persecution and death of those women convicted of witchcraft and in particular the origins of the Calder Witches in 1644. He then went on to recount the story of Lord Torphichen's son, who was believed to have been possessed by evil spirits which resulted in a witchhunt in the surrounding area. He then went on to give a brief insight into Lizzie Bryce (Baxter) who, when an old woman, had such a frightening presence to local children especially, was referred to as “that old witch”. Because of the folklore, the area in Livingston became known as Lizzie Bryce's Strip and then the Lizzie Bryce roundabout which was subsequently built in the same area. Rev. Povey believed that superstition was the main cause of the witchhunts until their demise in 1707. Joe thanked Rev. Povey for taking time out of his very busy schedule and giving such an entertaining talk to the members.
