- 8. **Holidays:** Heather Waddell has agreed to organise some holidays for the membership. She is planning a visit to Chester Christmas Market in November (22nd 24th) for three days/two nights at a cost of £129, dinner, bed and breakfast and staying the in Cumbria Grand Hotel. There are a limited number of single rooms. There is a lift to all floors and there is also free porterage.
