West Lothian 50+ Network Minute of Members' Meeting – 18th November 2023

Network Chair, Sue Bedford-Visser, opened the meeting by welcoming members new and old, and introduced the guest speaker, Joseph Witcombe from The Antonine Guard.

1. Guest Speaker

The Antonine Guard is a re-enactment society and a Scottish Charity, founded in 1996 to promote awareness of Scotland's Roman heritage.

Joseph still gave an interesting talk, covering the period of Roman occupation of Scotland and the history of the Roman Empire. He described the life of a Roman Legionnaire, whose uniform he was wearing. Roam soldiers were not necessarily from Rome but could be from anywhere in the Roman Empire. After serving 25 years, soldiers became citizens of Rome and could travel anywhere in the Roman Empire. He went into detail about the uniform he was wearing, describing how and what materials it would have been constructed from back in Roman times as well as covering the day-to-day life of a soldier. After the talk, Joseph stayed for coffee and to chat with members.
