## 10. SCAMS

We have been made aware by Age Scotland of an older person receiving a phone call claiming to be from Age Scotland, requesting bank details for a £500 grant. Please be aware this is **not** something Age Scotland are affiliated with; their helpline advisers will never ask for your bank details.

As scam attempts get increasingly sophisticated and convincing, it's so important to report them and seek help if you need it. For more information and advice visit age.scot/avoidingscams

Age Scotland have published a booklet on avoiding scams. We intend to email this booklet to you in pdf format with the Minutes of this meeting.

On this subject, on Friday evening, the Network became aware that a number of our members had been copied into an email allegedly sent from a West Lothian 50+ Network email account). We can confirm that the email was not sent from the Network and are currently investigating with our IT providers how this happened, as well as looking into additional security measures. If you were a recipient of this email, please delete it. Please do not reply "to all" querying this email as that perpetuates the problem.

The Network is very sorry if you have been affected by this in any way. We take the protection of our member's personal information very seriously. Please accept the Board's apologies for any worry and inconvenience that this has caused.

## 14. Next Members Meeting including final Members Meeting of the West Lothian 50+ Network (SC024257)

Our next meeting will take place on **Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> February** at 10.30 am in St Mary's Hall and our guest speaker will be Mel Hughes from the Canine Concern Scotland Trust who will be bringing along a Therapet.

This meeting will include the **final Members Meeting of the West Lothian 50+ Network (SC024257).** You may be aware that last year we began the process of transitioning the Network into a new legal structure, a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO), and began to operate as the West Lothian 50+ Network (SCIO) (SC051335) with effect from 1 October 2023.

Final accounts are being prepared for the "old" Network, in preparation for the transfer of all the assets and liabilities to the West Lothian 50+ Network (SCIO), and finally the dissolution of SC024257.

As part of this process, we must hold a final Members Meeting of the West Lothian 50+ Network (SC024257). There will be a short Convenor's Report covering the period 1 April 2023 to 30 September 2023 and a final set of accounts for that period.

Two resolutions will be proposed:

- To adopt the accounts (subject to examination by the external accountants if that has not been completed)
- To confirm with members that steps be taken to wind up the (old) West Lothian 50+ Network following transfer of all the assets and liabilities to the West Lothian 50+ Network (SCIO)

All members are welcome, however please note that you are only entitled to vote on these resolutions if your membership started before 1 October 2023. Members joining after that date are members of the SCIO as will be members renewing at 1 April 2024 and the first AGM of the SCIO is likely to be in August 2024.

## 15. Membership Subscriptions

Many members pay their annual subscription in January or February possibly because the renewal date was once 1<sup>st</sup> January, but it is now 1<sup>st</sup> April. If you pay by standing order, direct debit or bank transfer, please note that the new bank details for the West Lothian 50+ Network (SCIO) are sort code 80 22 60, account number 24654562. The new annual subscription is £24. Please amend your bank instructions, if necessary, as the old bank account will be closed in the very near future.
